

Markos Said to Back Cominform

ROME, July 1 (AP)—Newspapers here said today in dispatches from Belgrade that Gen. Markos Vafiades, Greek guerrilla leader, had sided with the Cominform against Marshal Tito. The dispatches said that General Vafiades' radio condemned the Yugoslav Communist party for attempting "to upset Balkan equilibrium" by proposing a Balkan bloc of Yugoslavia, Bulgaria and Albania.
